9. Outline of career: John James Marshall (1807-1877) was born in Darlington District, South Carolina. He was the brother of Henry Marshall. Married Maria Cogdell Hawes, January 22, 1829. He was pioneer settler in North Louisiana and lived at Allandale Plantation in DeSoto Parish. His son, John Julian, married Mattie Dashiell Nicholson.

10. Scope and contents of collection: Four ledgers including: employee records; accounts with debits and credits; sick book; sales of land; individual accounts; Trinity Mission Account; rental and consignment accounts; fund for All Saints' Church; cattle records and crop records.

Employee records: Accounts with debits and credits; sick book.
- #2 John Julian Marshall. Jan. 1, 1883 - Jan. 1, 1886.  
Includes records of Trinity Mission (Episcopal Chapel at Land's End Plantation, 1883-1885). Sale of land (360 acres) to Tom Graham Individual accounts; account for Trinity Mission and Rev. O. Wilson; rental accounts; consignment accounts.
- #3 Ledger "G". John Julian Marshall, 1886-1888.  
Records of All Saints' Church (pages 148-152).
- #4 John Julian Marshall, 1893-1900. Records of cattle and sales of produce; corn crop; oat crop; butter shipped; produce sales.
