Volunteers of America North Louisiana

Biographical Description

The Volunteers of America was founded in 1896 by social reformers Ballington and Maud Booth, as a movement dedicated to uplifting the American people. Volunteers would commit to the mission of bringing food, medicine and comfort to people not served by other charities.

The Volunteers of American North Louisiana was established in 1935 with a maternity home in Shreveport. Over the years, VOA-NL created thousands of loving families through adoption. As community needs changed, VOA-NL responded with a range of services. In the 1970s, VOA-NL was among the first to open group homes for people with disabilities. In 1986, they opened an office in Alexandria. A few years later in 1989, they acquired the LightHouse, a community center in downtown Shreveport. Their most recent effort is serving those who served us, the veterans. In April 2010, VOA-NL opened a 56-bed transitional home for homeless veterans.

Today the VOA-NL reaches over 8,000 people a year by providing affordable senior housing, residential support for individuals with intellectual, mental and physical disabilities, services for children and families. VOA is a faith-based organization. Although founded on Christianity, the ministry brings all people of all faiths together in service.

Scope and Content

The Volunteers of America North Louisiana Collection has three major categories of material. The first is the large array of donor compiled binders and scrapbooks, which contain newspaper clippings, programs, resumes, publications, and financial development. The second are the boxes of the history, policies, and procedures, minutes and programs of the internal workings of the VOANL. The large media section follows with the photographs, VHS tapes, and DVDs of thousands of images of children and volunteers.

Series Description

Series I: The forty binders and scrapbooks from 1935-2016 contain articles about the VOANL, staff members, programs and publications and fundraisers.

Series II: The history, policy and minutes of the VOANL follow.

Series III: Programs, goals and evaluations are alphabetized by program.
