Professional information

Ronald Maburn Rice (1933-2021) was an artist for almost sixty years and worked in almost every medium of commercial art. He began his career in Dallas, Texas where he worked in an animation studio at the Dallas Times Herald and at WFAA TV. Later he worked in art and marketing departments of local television, newspaper, outdoor advertising, and independent art studios. He was the graphic artist for both local newspapers, first at The *Shreveport Journal* and then he retired from The *Times* in 1998.

During his entire professional career, he was also a free-lance artist and was commissioned for countless caricatures of individuals, families, athletes, and professional leaders of Shreveport and Bossier City. Of all the artwork that he produced, he was probably most proud of his originals and prints of his beloved LSU Tigers in both football and baseball.

Ron Rice "Drawing and baseball...that's what I do! In between the two, I'm addicted to good, old movies. Art and baseball came to me about the same time at age thirteen. I did work harder at developing my abilities at baseball. That got me a baseball scholarship to Centenary College. Art was put on hold.

That got me a pro baseball contract and *a brief career*....a broken hand in the middle of the first season was the reason, not the curve ball!! Pro baseball came to an end.

That got me drafted into the U.S. Army, in the Canal Zone, where I played two seasons of baseball.

It was time to get back to art. I had no formal training, so I enrolled at Ringling School of Art and Design in Sarasota, Florida. After two years there, I landed my first art job with a newspaper in Dallas, Texas.

My art/marketing career has been with newspapers and television. I did manage to squeeze in 37 summers and two high school seasons of coaching baseball.

Now retired from all that, I'm doing what I have the most fun with...cartooning animals, and stories of the Louisiana bayou...one of which is the Bayou Bengal. ...and in between, watching good, old movies." (from Ron Rice website)

1942: First illustrated poem. when Rice was 9 years old. "Fishing"

1945: Wild West saloon brawl (color), when Rice was 12 years old. Also, Vikings, Marco Polo, western themes with fighting and horses.

1946: Wild West saloon brawl, when he was 13 years old.

1948: Bucking Horse in rodeo, when Rice was 15 years old.

1948-1951: Collage (26x24) of wild animals-lions, tigers, coyote, elephant, tree kangaroo, orangutan, gorilla, mandrill, hippopotamus, leopard, black Howler monkey, water buffalo, American tapir, jaguar. Probably when Rice was in high school. His sketch book pages show his interest in football with a sense of humor in play. Horses and western themes also continue.

1957: Ron Rice is in the Ringling School of Art in Sarasota, Florida and his art school project of Frank Sinatra in grease pencil and ink is included here.

1958: On set of movie Horse Soldiers, Ron sketched John Wayne and William Holden.

1959: First on-air logo design, channel 3 February 15, 1959. "I was the first art department for channel 3" (Ron Rice)

1962: Sports color cartoons used on KTBS-TV Sports Show.

1962: Tommy Davis 49ers. Charcoal and color ink. Drawn free-hand from photograph.

1965: Two art jobs (pamphlets) for WFAA-TV, Dallas, Texas.

1965: 16x20 charcoal of Bonneau Peters, owner of the original Shreveport Sports.

1966: Cover art while working at WFAA-TV. Job title: Assistant to Promotions.
